Ancient Words

John 15:1-5 (Inclusive Bible)

"I am the true vine, and my Abba is the vine grower who cuts off every branch in me that doesn't bear fruit, but prunes the fruitful ones to increase their yield. You've been pruned already, thanks to the word that I have spoken to you. Live on in me, as I do you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit of itself apart from the vine, neither can you bear fruit apart from me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who live in me and I in them will bear abundant fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing.

Contemporary Words

The metaphor of the vine and branches represents the unity of Jesus and the disciples. The unity is a given, but it does not exist apart from the disciples' own participation. Jesus is both the one who

commands them to abide and bear fruit and the one who enables them to do so. Their bearing fruit is proof they are Jesus' disciples. Jesus has linked discipleship with mutual love ... The abiding and bearing of fruit of which Jesus speaks is the mutuality of love among the disciples.
